Legislation

Uniform Collaborative Law Act

I am the sponsor of <u>Senate Bill 31</u>, which creates the <u>Uniform Collaborative Law Act</u>. The collaborative law process allows disputes to be resolved without involving the court. This would reduce the need for lawsuits and conserve judicial resources. This optional process would be available for divorce and custody proceedings where both parties are willing to work collaboratively.

Forest preserve mining ban

In an effort to protect local control over forest preserve land, I introduced <u>Senate</u> <u>Bill 1344</u>. This legislation ensures that land the people set aside as permanent forest preserves, by referendum, will be protected and will not be used for any sand, gravel or other mining operation.

Homeless Bill of Rights

I am also the chief co-sponsor of the <u>Bill of</u> <u>Rights for the Homeless Act</u>. This



legislation aims to ensure no one will be discriminated against because he or she is homeless. This legislation will help those most in need find employment and protect their dignity.

ECC Job Fair

There will be a <u>veteran's job fair</u> from 10 to 11 a.m. Friday, April 19 at the Spartan Events Center at Elgin Community College. Later that same day, there will be a <u>community job fair</u> from 1 to 4 p.m. at the Spartan Events Center. These events are presented by ECC, the Illinois Department of Employment Security and the Illinois Department of Veterans Affairs.

Housing Fair

There will be a housing fair from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday, April 20 at the Gail Borden Library. Neighborhood Housing Services - Fox Valley, the city of Elgin, the Elgin Community Network, BMO Harris Bank and the Gail Borden Library have partnered to present housing information for residents. Presentations will be made to help prepare buyers for home ownership, build and repair credit, apply for down payment assistance programs, apply for city grants for housing and learn about NHS homes for sale.
